Maryland's Role in the Immigration Debate

The Trump administration's policies have brought on a national debate on immigration that also plays out at the state and local level.

For example, the Maryland General Assembly, which meets through April 9, is considering a half-dozen bills that would have an impact on immigrants in Maryland.

This 75-minute discussion will focus on understanding the terms used in the current immigration debate as well as key bills before the legislature. George Clack, a member of IndivisibleHoCoMD's Immigration Action Team and the editor of "Immigration News," will lead the discussion.

LET OUR LIGHT SHINE



In a terrific example of "thinking globally and acting locally," IndivisibleHoCo's Environmental Action Team has since last summer led a concerted effort involving multiple organizations to encourage the City of Columbia's governing body, the Columbia Association (CA) Board of Directors, to strengthen Columbia's focus on climate action. Going beyond it's October 2017 endorsement of the "We Are Still In" declaration supporting the Paris Agreement, the CA Board decided virtually unanimously on February 22 to create a new "Climate Change and Sustainability Advisory Committee." The Committee will consist of 11 individuals appointed by the CA Board and representing a mix of community stakeholders to be selected based on their relevant experience, educational background, and interest in climate change. The Committee's charter is to focus primarily on climate change, while also addressing other sustainability topics, such as resiliency, energy efficiency, waste management, water efficiency, and outdoor environmental quality. As global agreements like the Paris Agreement will succeed only to the extent that states and local communities take stronger climate action, CA's

decision is an important advance that also sets an outstanding example for Howard County and other communities in Maryland. .
