An Uneven Playing Field





"It all comes back to the states." –Gaby Goldstein, Sister District

- States control redistricting; redistricting determines who controls Congress.
- GOP-controlled state legislatures are passing laws that enable the state legislature, not the voters, to decide which Presidential candidate gets the electoral votes for that state.



REPUBLICAN & DEMOCRATIC CONTROL OF STATE LEGISLATURES IN 2021

Republican control of legislature and Democratic control of the executive-7 states
Republican control of the executive and Democratic control of the legislature-3 states
Democratic control of the executive and legislature-16 states

- States legislate matters that directly influence our daily lives.
- □ State leaders become national leaders.
- Policies enacted by one state legislature often spread to other state legislatures. State laws become federal laws.



TX abortion law (citizen lawsuit provisions) TN & FL anti-LGBTQ laws



Since 2019, VA's Democratic majority legislature has...

- ✓ Rolled back abortion restrictions
- ✓ Expanded voting rights
- ✓ Raised the minimum wage
- ✓ Expanded Medicaid for 400,000 Virginians
- ✓ Raised teacher pay
- \checkmark Protected the environment
- ✓ Expanded background checks for gun purchases
- ✓ Protected the LGBTQ+ community
- ✓ And passed the ERA
- ✓Abolished capital punishment



Why Virginia?

- □ The commonwealth is not a definitively blue state. From 1970-2018 the political pendulum swung back & forth.
- In 2019 Democrats flipped the VA House & Senate. Virginia's 2021 state elections will be the first test of public approval for the Biden administration and the state's governing Democratic trifecta!
